North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University (NC A&T SU): North Carolina A&T State University is a learner-centered community that develops and preserves intellectual capital through interdisciplinary learning, discovery, engagement, and operational excellence. NC A&T was established in 1891 as the A. and M. College for the “Colored Race”. Today, it is classified by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching as a doctoral-granting research university (high research activity) and offers 117 undergraduate degree programs, more than 58 master’s degree programs, and Ph.D. programs in Mechanical, Electrical and Industrial Engineering, Energy and Environmental Systems; and Leadership Studies.
